

Outstanding QRT, Outreach, and Engagement Initiatives: Small Community

Huron County QRT

<u>Program Timeline</u> The Huron County QRT is a collaboration between the Huron County Sheriff's Department, Norwalk Police Department, Willard Police Department, Monroeville Police Department, New London Police Department, Firelands Counseling and Recovery Services, Family Life Counseling, Oriana House, Let's Get Real, Certified Peer Supporters, and the Huron County Board of Mental Health and Addiction Services. The team conducts post overdose response services, visiting the home of individuals who have recently overdosed, providing support and resources. Follow up phone calls and visits are made to individuals offering ongoing support.

<u>Operations, Services Provided:</u> Huron County QRT offers a wide range of services to community members. Services such as:

 Peer Recovery Support Services: provided by Let's Get Real, including a walk-in peer center, Warm Handoff Services in partnership with local hospitals, specialty docket support, 24/7 on-call peer services to the Norwalk Police Department, Huron County Sheriff's Office, and Willard Police Department, ongoing peer support services, and

- support group meetings. Let's Get Real also serves as the county's only Project Dawn location, allowing for increased access and distribution of Naloxone throughout the community."
- Treatment and Medication Assisted Treatment services: Are available through Family Life Counseling & Psychiatric Services, Firelands Counseling & Recovery Services, and Oriana House, Inc. All three treatment providers offer Recovery Navigator services which benefit the community by offering a single point of contact for persons with Opioid Use Disorders and Stimulant Use Disorders.
- Free Mobile App: Available for download at Google Play and the App Store for use by all Huron County residents. The Huron County Wellness App is a one stop shop for local mental health, substance use and wellness resources.
