Here is some initial African American QRT data – 952 total referrals (60% male) from April 2018 - Present

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2019 – (1) Referral
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2020- (4) Referral

2021 – (339) Referral **started receiving CFD data in March 2021.

2022 - (583) Referral

2023- (33) Referrals thus far

Breakdown of the 952 referrals:

594 (62.3%) – Proactive Outreach/Received Harm Reduction Materials

131 (13.7%) — Unable to Contact

128 (13.4%) – Declined/Withdrew

63 (6.6%) - Connected/Referred to Treatment

25 (2.6%) – Ineligible (deceased, incarcerated, out of county, safety concern, etc.)

11 (1.1%) – Actively Open
