

## Operation Bridge

**Bridging Recovery & Interdiction Data Gathering Enforcement.** 

In October ODA Board Member and former South-**Central Ohio Major Crimes Unit Commander** Dennis Lowe accepted a new position with Ohio **Department of Public Safety Office of Criminal Justice Services as the Ohio Drug Task Forces** Liaison and Operation BRIDGE Coordinator. In his new position Dennis will work closely with Ohio's multi-jurisdictional law enforcement task forces and oversee Operation BRIDGE for the Department of Public Safety. BRIDGE is a multidisciplinary deflection program bringing together public safety and behavioral/mental health partners in a coordinated effort to address the supply of illicit drugs entering communities while offering community resources and expedited access to treatment for those with substance use disorders.

## **Available Funding** Opportunities

### **ODA Mini Grants:**

- The ODA board approved the opening of the application process for any a. ODA member to apply for funding to support your deflection efforts—a limit of \$1,000 per team/site in a calendar year.
  - ODA Mini-grant funding can be used for any "Deflection" related b. expense. Food,

materials, contingency management items (e.g., gift cards), IDs, birth certificates, and whatever else your team might need.

- Ohio teams/sites will take precedence in selecting the priority of C. application for funds.
- With that said, all ODA members are encouraged to apply for funding.
- This is a reminder for all 2024 ODA Summit registrants that your registration includes a 13-month ODA membership until February 2025.
